We are thrilled to announce that this year marks a significant milestone for Glenthorne High School as some of our talented Science students reached the final stage of the UK CanSat National STEM Final, which took place from 16th to 18th April at York University. This achievement is particularly remarkable as it is the first time a team from Glenthorne has made it to the final round of this prestigious competition.



CanSat, short for "Can Satellite," is an exhilarating competition where students are challenged to design and build a fully functional satellite that fits inside a standard-sized soda can. Our students showcased their ingenuity, technical skills, and teamwork throughout the competition, demonstrating their commitment to excellence.



While our students did not secure the top position, they have much to be proud of. They successfully transmitted and received data from their CanSat in flight, a feat that sets them apart from many other teams. The judges recognized their exceptional graphing skills, and fellow teachers praised their impressive presentation abilities. As a testament to their achievements, all our students received the prestigious gold industrial cadet awards.




National Theatre Connections Festival
