Positive Space	The space occupied by the main subjects or objects in an artwork.
Contour Drawing	Drawing technique that outlines the edges and surface ridges of a subject.
Gradient Wash	A watercolour technique where colour gradually changes from dark to light.
Variegated Wash	A watercolour technique blending multiple colours to create a varied effect.
Collage	An art technique involving assembling different materials (paper, fabric, photos) onto a surface.
Tonal Ladder	A scale showing a range of tones from light to dark, used to practice shading.
