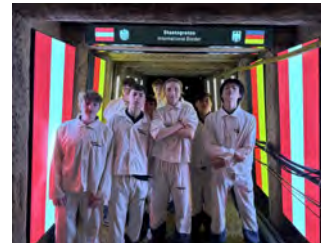
**Non-residential year 8 and 9**

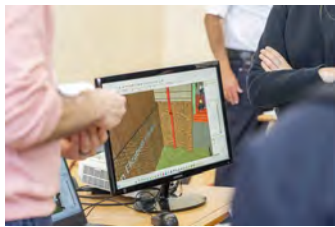

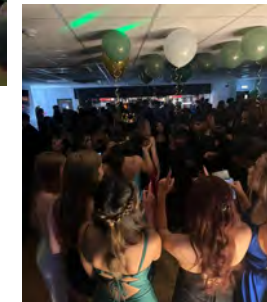


**Year 11**

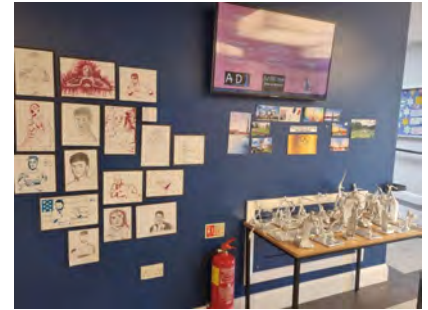

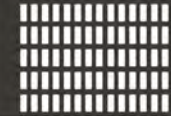
