M13- Revision Module

his unit revisits all 12 modules that are studied at A Level, as well as completing evision on both the literature and the film. The aim of this unit is to get students exam-ready and undergraduate-ready.

Future Education, Employment & Training

M12- La Résistance

This unit looks at the French resistance, focusing on: Actions of the French resistance. Jean Moulir and famous female figures of the resistance. Charles De Gaulle and Les Français Libres.

M10- La France occupée

This unit looks at the German occupation of France during the Second World War, focusing on: Collaboration with the Nazis. The nature of anti-Semitism in France under the occupation and life for the French under the Vichy regime

M11- Le regime de Vichy

This unit looks at the Vichy regime during the Second World War, focusing on: The historical figure Maréchal Pétain. The policies of the Vichy regime with La Révolution Nationale. The position of women in Vichy France.

M9- L'extreme droite.

This unit looks at the worrying rise of the far right in France, focusing on: The rise of Rassemblement National (Formerly known as Front National). The aims of RN party leaders

Jean-Marie Le Pen and Marine Le Pen and Public opinion.

M8- Les défis de l'immigration et de l'intégration en

This unit looks at the challenges of immigration in France, focusing on: The effects of immigration on local people. The challenges and benefits of multiculturalism and issues surrounding multiculturalism in France.

M7 – L'impact positif de l'immigration en France

This unit looks at immigration in France, focusing on: The origins of immigrants and their reasons for coming to France. The positive contribution of immigrants in France and how immigrants enrich French culture.

One-on-one speaking sessions

All Year 13 students will have a 15 minute one-on-one speaking session per fortnight in preparation for the A Level Speaking exam.



M6 – Les festivals et les traditions

This unit looks at festivals and traditions, focusing on: Celebrations in francophone countries.

Customs and traditions in France and other francophone countries.

M5 – Les Médias

This unit looks at music in France, focusing on: Freedom of speech in Francophone countries. Print and Online media in Francophone countries. The effect of the media on politics and society in francophone countries.

M4 – La Musique

This unit looks at music in France, focusing on: Francophone music past and present, La chanson française and Haitian music and the influence and importance of music and Francophone music.

M3 - Le monde du travail

This unit deals with the world of work in France, focusing on: Work-life balance and attitudes to work, reasons why people strike, their rights and trade unionism, gender discrimination in the workplace.

M2- L'éducation

This unit deals with the education system in France, focusing on: The structure of the French education system, Student stress and issues in the system, higher education, and ways of adapting to working life.

M1 – Les changements dans les structures familiales

This unit deals with the changing family structure in France, focusing on How the structure of the family is changing, the institution of marriage and relationships within the family.



M0 – Bridging the Gap

This unit focuses on mastery and skill of the key GCSE / A Level Grammar points that underpin the French language.
