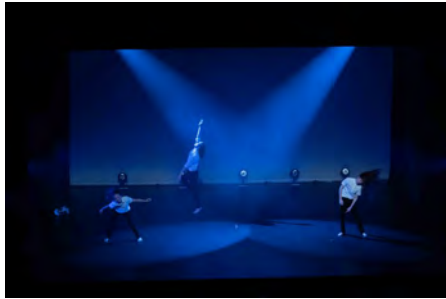




Impact 2024!

Wind Turbine Challenge

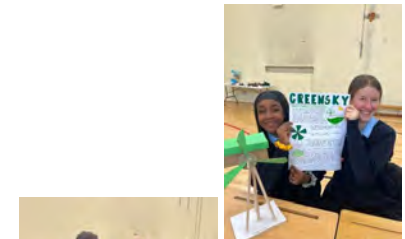
