



Students' Performance Evening



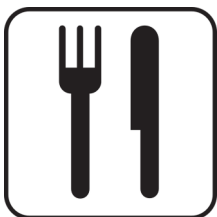

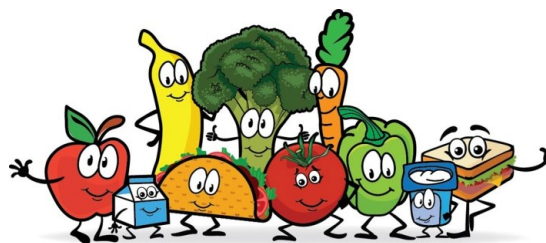
New Catering Company announced
