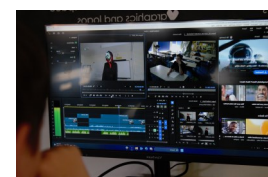
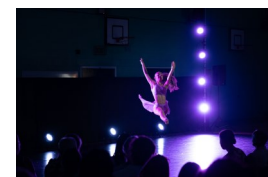

We have had a very positive three days with the Ofsted team, who have thoroughly reviewed our SCITT provision. The focus was ITaPs, mentoring & SEND and a range of schools, leaders, trainees, mentors and Headteachers took part in the thematic monitoring visit. It was recognised we have a strong provision in both primary and secondary and everything we do is rigorous and carefully thought through. We recruit high calibre trainees who are supported by mentors who go 'above and beyond'. Our research is carefully chosen to have impact on the trainees and thoroughly prepare them for the ECT years and beyond. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, and we are very proud of the hard work and support we have from everyone involved in our partnership.
